



Class 1 Home learning 14th March 2025

Home learning tasks:

What a busy week... the children had a fantastic time learning all about where fruits come from in our Geography topic. Asda man visited us in class 1 and all of the children were brave and tried lots of different fruits; dragon fruit, passionfruit, avocado and pomegranate.

In maths, we are extending our learning on multiplication and Year 2 have begun looking at arrays and how to read them. Year 1 have been practising counting and recognising multiples of 2, 5 and 10. In English, the children came up with some amazing new ideas for LRRH to defeat the wolf at Granny's house, from smelly onions to make him cry and holly to prickle his feet to covering him in sticky jam so he gets chased off by hungry birds. I am very much looking forward to reading their finished stories.

Reading.

Year 1

Your child will be bringing home a book this week which they read with you and also during guided reading, the aim is that this book is read multiple times to practise their phonics and fluency. They can also bring home a picture book to share. Please aim to read with you child 3 times a week and sign their reading records.

Year 2. Your child now has an Accelerated reader book. They will keep this book and read it both at home and in 1-1 reading until they can read it fluently. They will also have guided reading sessions in class with Mrs Mitchell using an additional Accelerated reader book.

***** For all children: regular reading and signing of the reading record by an adult earns your child a reward. If they read 10 times with their book signed, they get a sticker; 5 stickers and they get a reading prize! *****

NEW Projects:

The making one!

The English one.
