

Class F Spring Term Learning overview.



Maths

We will continue to practice our skills in:

- · counting,
- recognising numbers
- writing numbers independently in our play.
- We will continue to look at 'time' by recording the date through days, months, year and seasons daily.
- Nursery children will be understanding numbers 1-6 through counting, subitising and recognising numerals and representing these in different ways.
- Reception children will be concentrating on pattern, shape and space and measures.

Personal Social and Emotional

- Sharing stories and circle times
- Develop confidence towards unfamiliar people and new social situations as well as speaking to others about their own needs, wants, interests and opinions.
- Valuing the opinions of others.
- Our weekly sessions of Jigsaw PSHE will explore the topics of 'Dreams and Goals' and 'Healthy Me.'



Spring one: Space







Communication, language and Literacy

- Practicing our speaking and listening skills when sharing our experiences and thoughts during circle times.
- We will be using talk to pretend objects are part of our play with others and re-telling and recreating roles from texts we have shared in play situations such as Baby bear in our whatever next story (Spring 1).
- We will be working on developing and expressing our stories on our own.

Example texts: Space:

Alien's Love Underpants, The Darkest Dark, Whatever Next

Example texts: Growing:

Oliver's Vegetables, Titch, Jasper's Beanstalk, Jack and the Beanstalk

Nursery children will take part in phonics sessions on the topics Body Percussion and Rhythm and Rhyme. They will engage in conversations about stories and learn new vocabulary.

Reception children will revise phase 2 sounds before moving on to learning phase 3 sounds. We will read, write and spell words including tricky words. They will write short sentences using their phonics knowledge.

Physical Development Fine and Gross motor:

 We aim to develop the children's confidence in moving in different ways (both fine and gross motor) and an awareness of space and others. During the term we will be looking at developing fine motor skills through using equipment such as knives, forks, paint brushes and pencils. We will develop gross motor skills through big movements in our outdoor play.

Health and Self-Care:

- We aim to encourage the children to gain greater independence with dressing and undressing including putting on their own coats
- Understand the importance of hand washing and healthy eating.
