

Class 1 Home learning 28th September

A busy few weeks settling in and adjusting to being in Year 1 and 2 now. We are having a great time making up new rhymes for our class Oi Frog story. The children have thought of new animals and what the animals are doing. We have great ideas like snakes' sleep on rakes and ants sleep on pants!!! I am looking forward to reading their finished stories. In maths, we have focused on the place value of numbers. Year 1 extending their knowledge up to and beyond 20 and year 2 working towards 100. This week we will be comparing numbers and using our fluency to explain how we know. Our new London topic has captured their interest a when exploring maps, finding capital cities and looking at different landmarks and tourist attractions.

Home learning tasks: Reading.

Year 1

Your child will be bringing home a book this week which they read with you and also during guided reading, the aim is that this book is read multiple times to practise their phonics and fluency. They can also being home a picture book to share. Please aim to read with you child 3 times a week and sign their reading records.

Year 2. Your child now has an Accelerated reader book. They will keep this book and read it both at home and in 1-1 reading until they can read it fluently. They will also have guided reading sessions in class with Mrs Mitchell using an additional Accelerated reader book.

*** For all children: regular reading and signing of the reading record by an adult earns your child a reward. If they read 10 times with their book signed, they get a sticker; 5 stickers and they get a reading prize! ***

<u>Project 1</u>

Choose a real animal that you are interested in, find out as much as you can about where it lives then, using recycled and leftover materials, build your animal habitat. I would then like you to bring it to school at the end of this term, show it to the class. Year 2, this is similar to last year but this time I would like you to be able to explain where your animal lives and WHY.

Project 2

Look again at landmarks across London like we have done in Geography then choose the one you like the most like the Shard or London Bridge. Can you create a piece of artwork to match – painting, drawing, collage, 3d, it's up to you. I have card and paper at school if you need it.
