

29/11/24 Home Learning Class F

This week, Christmas arrived in Class F. The children have learnt about the nativity story and have been busy practising their parts and singing the songs for our class nativity. We have looked at items of a Christmas theme and discussed how they are linked with Christmas and the nativity before playing a memory game with them. The children have created their own wrapping paper using brown paper and stamps to create a design.

In phonics, the reception children have learnt the Phase 2 sounds u and r. They have then revised the sounds ck, e, u and r with a sound hunt. For maths, the children have carried out activities linked to 2d and 3d shapes.

The Nursery children have been continuing with their instrumental sounds phonics sessions. They have been learning the names of instruments and the sounds these make when using them in games. In maths they have been learning about pattern and have been creating AB patterns in their sessions thinking about colour and being able to finish the stem sentence "I can see the pattern...".

Projects: Please choose one (or more!) of the following options to complete over the second half of the Autumn Term.

- 1. Your child should have a set of flash cards (in their bookbags) to practise the Phase 2 sounds they have learnt in school so far. Please use these flash cards to help reinforce the sounds. You might also like to play some games using these sounds on <u>www.phonicsplay.co.uk</u>
- 2. Sing number songs and share nursery rhymes and books with your child.
- 3. Our topic for the second half of this term is going to be based around the season of Autumn. Collect some autumn treasures with your child. This might be conkers, acorns or various coloured and shaped leaves. The children can then bring these in to share with the rest of the class.
- 4. With the Autumn treasures you have collected, you might like to study these items before drawing them, painting them or even making art with them such as leaf stamping. These could be brought into school to share with the rest of the class. Ideas can be found below:
