Projects:

Please choose two of the following options to complete over the first half of the Spring Term.

This will be due in by Friday 14th February 2025.

1. Science: This term we are learning about animals. Create your own new animal with characteristics of two different animal groups ie. Reptiles and mammals. Then label it with the characteristics of these two groups.
2. Geography: We are learning about natural disasters. Research and present information on volcanos or earthquakes with causes, examples and impact. This can be presented online or on paper.
3. Art: We will be looking at Hokusai's piece "The Wave" this term. Create your own version of this piece in whatever medium you desire.
4. Create a persuasive letter to try and persuade someone using the skills we have learnt in class ie. A letter to Mr Long asking for additional break. A letter to your parents asking for the introduction of cake for breakfast day every Thursday.
