



Class 1 Home learning 15th November 2024

Thank you for the home learning tasks so far, we are going to have an very festive classroom this year sprinkled in with some lovely, 17th Century buildings!

In the coming weeks we will be busy exploring how different life was in London 400 years ago, finding out what caused the Great Fire and why it was worse then than it would be today.

In maths, we are moving on and focusing on shape, in particular naming and describing 2d and 3d shapes and then using the language for position, direction and movement.

Home learning tasks:

Reading.

Year 1

Your child will be bringing home a book this week which they read with you and also during guided reading, the aim is that this book is read multiple times to practise their phonics and fluency. They can also bring home a picture book to share. Please aim to read with you child 3 times a week and sign their reading records.

Year 2. Your child now has an Accelerated reader book. They will keep this book and read it both at home and in 1-1 reading until they can read it fluently. They will also have guided reading sessions in class with Mrs Mitchell using an additional Accelerated reader book.

***** For all children: regular reading and signing of the reading record by an adult earns your child a reward. If they read 10 times with their book signed, they get a sticker; 5 stickers and they get a reading prize! *****

My Maths – Year 2.

Thank you to the children who completed the My Maths task for this week... a star is on the way to you.

There is a new MONEY task set on the my maths app. It is something we have learnt in class using either counting on or adding on using a number line so please do have a go at all of the questions. I will take a look in a week and see how you have got on.

Projects:

Just a reminder: these projects continue all term and are not due until the week before we finish for Christmas. Your child must try to complete at least 1

project. They can just do 1, they make like the sound of 2 or they may hope to complete all 3. It is up to you. ALL home learning is shared and celebrated in class and your child earns a star for what they have created. We have had some fab ones so far, keep up the great work.

The making one!

Do some research and find out what the houses looked like from 1666 when the Great Fire of London took place. Using junk modelling, paint, paper etc, please make a house of your own? We will use these to create our own class street scene from the time.

The English one.

We have been writing a story all about Boa and his bad birthday and now created our own Hedgehog version.

Can you think of your own new animal and write your own 'Bad Birthday' story or make a comic strip story. Try to remember, your character needs some presents which are not quite right first, then one at the end which seems bad but turns out to be amazing. You can make it into a book with a front cover, create a comic book with drawings and writing, its up to you. Happy writing.
