



## **15/11/24 Home Learning Class F**

This week, Class F's learning has been based around the book 'Don't Hog the Hedge' with a hibernation theme. The children have sung a song about Hedgehogs, learnt facts about the animal and then created their own hedgehog fact files.

In phonics, the reception children have spent time revising the phase 2 sounds they have learnt so far and learnt the tricky words 'and' and 'to'. They have thought about the parts that make up numbers using the part whole model.

The Nursery children have continued their instrumental sounds phonics learning with activities including instruments. They have also moved onto pattern in their maths learning thinking about AB patterns with colours and cubes.

1. Your child should have a set of flash cards to practise the Phase 2 sounds they have learnt in school so far. Please use these flash cards to help reinforce the sounds. You might also like to play some games using these sounds on [www.phonicsplay.co.uk](http://www.phonicsplay.co.uk)
2. Sing number songs and share nursery rhymes and books with your child.
3. Our topic for the second half of this term is going to be based around the season of Autumn. Collect some autumn treasures with your child. This might be conkers, acorns or various coloured and shaped leaves. The children can then bring these in to share with the rest of the class.
4. With the Autumn treasures you have collected, you might like to study these items before drawing them, painting them or even making art with them such as leaf stamping. These could be brought into school to share with the rest of the class. Ideas can be found below:
